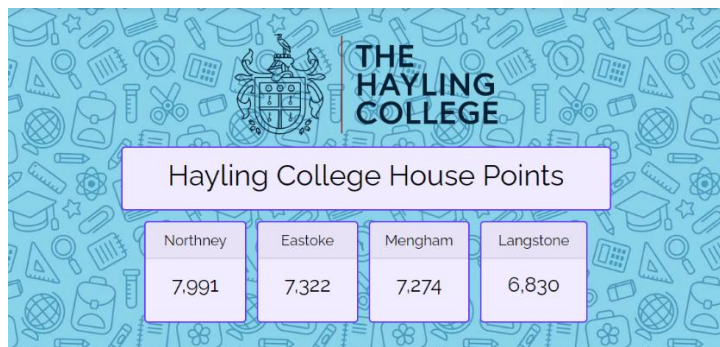

During this week we will be holding various events for everyone to take part in, from Guessing the Number of Sweets in a Jar and

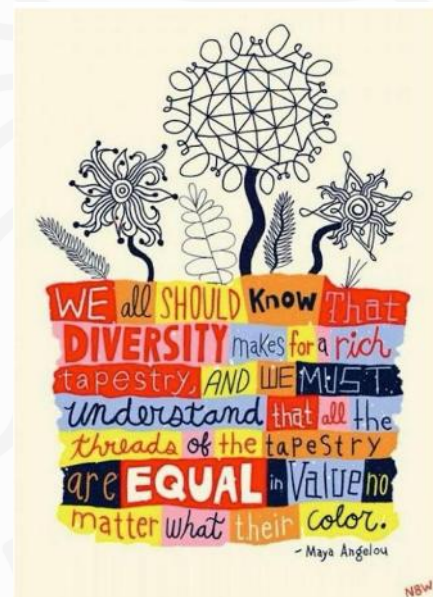
