As we head into the final handful of weeks of the academic year, last week was another vibrant and productive one across the school. I continue to be impressed by the drive and resilience our pupils and staff show each day, and I'm pleased to share some highlights from what has been an especially eventful and positive week.

Our Year 11 pupils are now in the final week of their GCSE examinations. I can hear them cheering now from under their final folders of revision for Physics, Spanish, Food, and D and T. It is important that we finish as well as we started and with only three more days to go the finishing line is in touching distance.

Keep going Year 11!

They've shown impressive focus and maturity as they complete the final part of their secondary education. The atmosphere they have created in school has been calm and purposeful, and the way they've conducted themselves has been a credit to themselves, their families, and the staff who've supported them throughout.

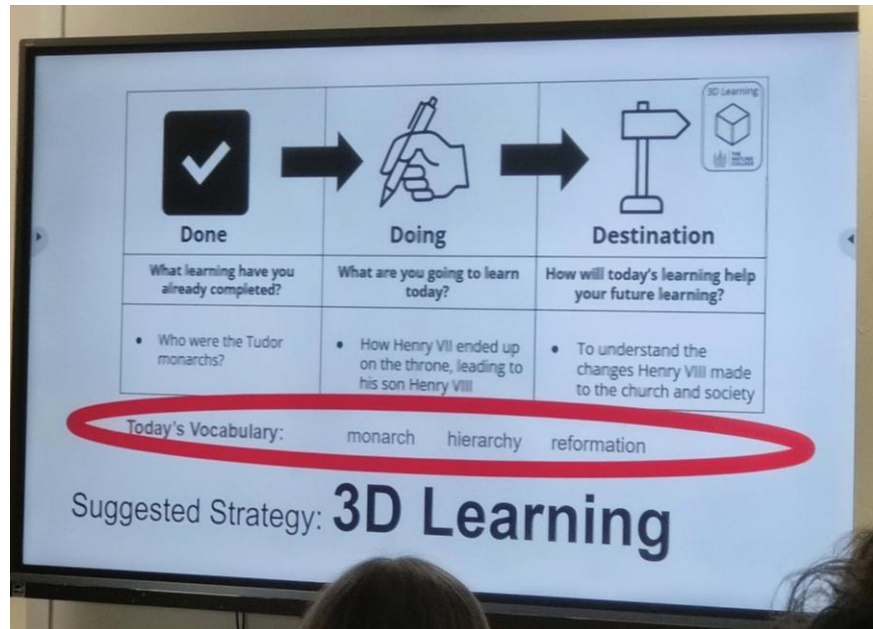
Meanwhile, our Year 10 pupils completed their mock examinations last week, and I'm pleased to report that feedback from staff and our exams team has been overwhelmingly positive. The vast majority of pupils approached the week with a mature attitude and a clear commitment to their studies. The results will help inform both planning and support as they head into Year 11. We will be reviewing their performance this term and working with the local authority to put plans in place that will hopefully have a big impact in our key subject areas.

Last week also saw another strong example of pupil voice in action, as Mr Lewington facilitated a school council meeting through our house system. This format continues to give every pupil a meaningful opportunity to influence school life. Their ideas and feedback are helping shape our ongoing development and ensuring pupil leadership remains a central part of our culture.



In terms of transition, our Year 6 programme continued with parent and pupil meetings that provided incoming families with a clear overview of what to expect in September. These sessions have been very well received and are an important part of helping our new pupils feel confident and supported ahead of the big move.

Professional development also remains active. Last Tuesday, Mr Fisher led a staff session focused on our eight adaptive teaching strategies. These practical approaches are designed to support all learners and ensure our teaching continues to meet the diverse needs of each class. It's encouraging to see how these strategies are already being discussed and trialled across departments.



Our extended leadership team met last week to continue our work on the next iteration of the school development plan. We'll be sharing a first draft this week for feedback. In parallel, our middle leaders have been actively involved in planning the peer reviews of all faculty areas, which will offer a valuable insight whilst promoting a culture of reflection and shared improvement. We also continue to work through the challenging task of finalising next year's timetable. This is never a straightforward process, particularly given the resource constraints schools continue to face, but we remain committed to making decisions in the best interests of our pupils.



Externally, I was pleased to attend the third ASCL Council meeting of the year at Warwick University. The session focused on SEND provision and included input from government, Ofsted, and DfE representatives. It was a valuable opportunity to contribute to national discussions and to bring fresh thinking back to our own setting. We are already planning new initiatives based on this work, including further development of our environmental area and outdoor classroom, supported by staff training that took place last week.

Last week also brought a number of celebrations and successes. The steady stream of Headteacher Gold Star Learner nominations reflects the consistently high standards being achieved in lessons. Congratulations to Denys and Reuben, who performed brilliantly at the Mountbatten Centre in Portsmouth and have now qualified for the regional athletics competitions. We



also want to recognise Isabelle's fantastic achievement in the Isle of Wight Round the Island Race, where she once again retained the B&G Young Sailor Award. Her continued success is a source of great pride for our school.

Our focus on inclusion and diversity continues, with ongoing activities recognising #Pride25 and Gypsy, Roma, and Traveller History Month. These efforts help strengthen our school's values and ensure all pupils feel seen, respected, and supported.

Looking ahead, pupils have a busy and engaging few weeks to enjoy. Tutor groups are finalising entries for the Clean Air Challenge logo competition, and National Sports Week kicks off, offering plenty of opportunities to earn house points and prizes. Our MFL Bake Off is set to be both a cultural and culinary highlight, and we are now into week three of the "30 Days of June" Wildlife Trust house competition—a reminder to everyone to submit their activity records for weeks one and two.

Our Year 10 pupils will soon attend college taster days, giving them valuable insight into post-16 options. And finally, this coming Wednesday is National Thank a Teacher Day. I encourage all pupils and families to take a moment to recognise any member of staff who's made a difference this year. A few kind words can go a long way.

Thank you for your continued support and engagement. I look forward to sharing more updates next week as we continue to round off the term together.

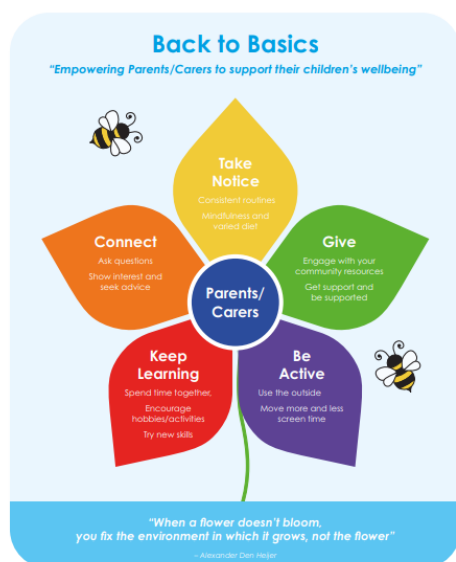
