In tutor time this term, we are continuing our tutor reading programme. Every week in tutor time students listen to a member of staff reading an extract from a novel and complete some work around key vocabulary and comprehension.

Last week, pupils listened to Ms Phillips reading an extract from Katherine Rundell's Impossible Creatures, which won the 2023 Waterstones Book of the Year, the 2023 Foyles Children's Book of the Year, and the 2024 Children's Fiction Book of the Year at the British Book Awards.

The novel, praised for its magical world-building, also contributed to Rundell being named Author of the Year at the 2024 British Book Awards.

This week, pupils are listening to Mrs Coram reading an extract from the science fantasy novel, City of Embers by Jeanne DuPrau, a highly acclaimed children's novel, winning the 2006 Mark Twain Award, 2006 William Allen White Children's Book Award, and the 2004 ALA Notable Children's Book.
