A thought-Provoking Read

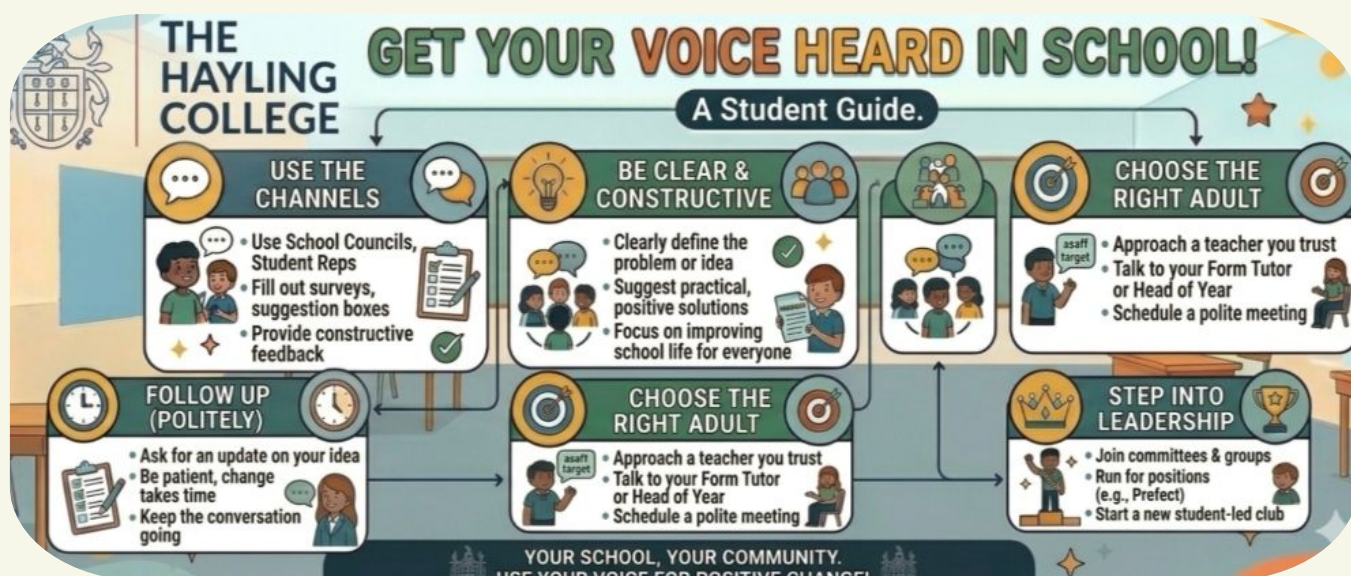
Students enjoyed discussing *My Name is Samim*, a powerful story about a young refugee boy escaping war in search of safety.

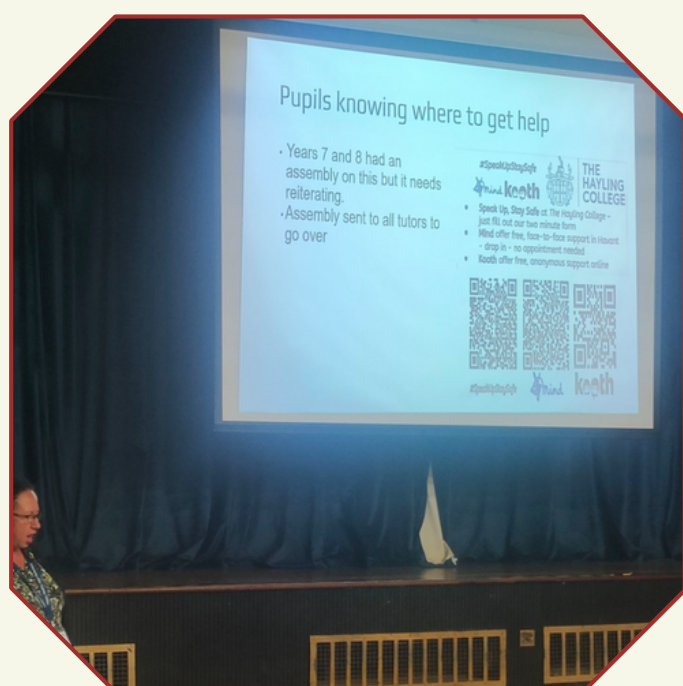

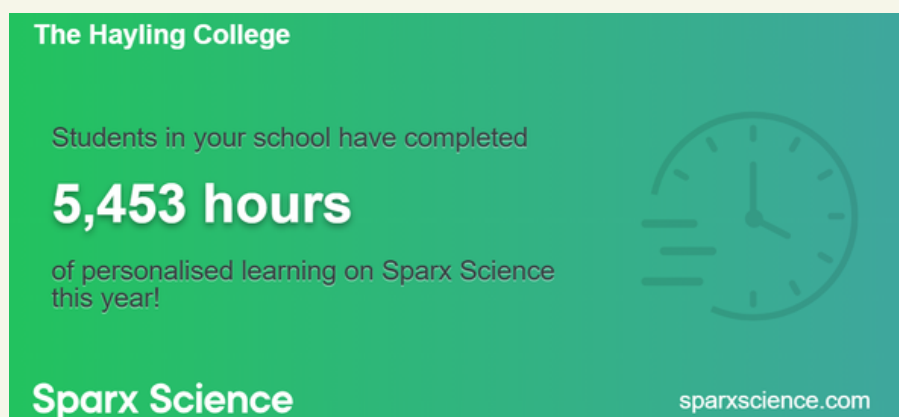

We are delighted to share the fantastic progress pupils are making in Sparx Science. So far, students have completed an incredible 5,453 hours of learning and answered an impressive 539,082 questions correctly.

This is a real testament to their dedication and perseverance, and we are very proud of the effort they are putting into developing their knowledge and confidence in science.



Sparx Reader Success

Our Sparx Reader programme is also going from strength to strength, with pupils completing 5,303 hours of reading and finishing 1,851 books so far this year.

These achievements reflect the positive reading habits our pupils are building, both in and beyond the classroom, and their growing enjoyment of reading.
